Lastly, while we've consistently and effectively served Philadelphia's older adult community, we've begun to modernize our communication avenues and technological solutions to serve a larger portion of the population, focusing on reaching working families.

ECA Overview

MISSION STATEMENT

Energy Coordinating Agency (ECA) is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization whose mission is to help people conserve energy and to promote a sustainable and socially equitable energy future for all. ECA leads the design and implementation of high-quality energy conservation, education, and home repair initiatives to eliminate energy burden and stabilize low-income families in their homes and communities.

HISTORY

In 1983, as residential utility terminations in Philadelphia increased from 3,000 to 30,000 in just one year, community activists, advocates, and faith leaders around the city called for a solution. The City of Philadelphia responded with the founding of ECA the following year. ECA started with the goal of improving access to energy assistance and conservation services for income eligible communities. In 1985, the network of Neighborhood Energy Centers came to fruition to deliver trusted education and streamline the utility bill assistance application processes. Since then our work has only expanded, with the ultimate goal of a just and resilient city.

Green Jobs

Training Center

Since 2009, ECA's Green Jobs Training Center has credentialed underserved minority youth and adults, including veterans and returning citizens, whose diversity reflects the city we serve. We prepare them for high-demand clean energy careers that provide family sustaining wages, such as those in solar, HVAC, residential energy efficiency, or green construction.

2023 IMPACT

In 2023, ECA trained over 250 students, certifying them with 12 industry credentials to serve them in their new careers. At no cost to the students, we offered six grant funded programs:

- Green Retrofit Immersive Training
- PECO Gas Mechanic/Technician
- HVAC Installer/Maintenance
- Brownfields Environmental Remediation
- Integrated Pest Management

In May 2023, we opened the Heat Pump Installation Lab and launched our 6th program. This state-of-the-art lab is the first of its kind in PA and is critical for training proper installation and maintenance of this green technology.

HIGHLIGHT: Brownfields Training

Meet the graduates of ECA's most recent cohort of our EPA Brownfields Environmental Remediation Training Program (pictured below)!

These 10 young people are now equipped with portable, stackable, in-demand certifications for careers turning abandoned, unusable land into green spaces. They're headed for placements that will earn them family sustaining wages and meaningful careers creating a cleaner and healthier Philadelphia.





EVENTS & EDUCATION

In 2023, ECA began hosting large scale Energy Resource Fairs, inviting partner organizations to join and provide support to communities across the city. We held five energy fairs with 100+ guests and attended an additional 20 tabling events.

Through partnership with Philadelphia Gas Works, we hosted eight DIY conservation workshops, demonstrating to 883 participants how they can make their homes more energy efficient and providing the kits to get started.



Community

Programs

Since 1985, ECA has coordinated a network of 16 Neighborhood Energy Centers (NECs) to prevent utility terminations and bring holistic support to Philadelphia communities, including utility bill assistance, budget counselling, and energy conservation education.

UTILITY ASSISTANCE

In 2023, ECA utilized our NECs and events to provide energy counseling and utility bill application assistance for 4,630 Philadelphia families and prevent 898 utility terminations.

Our dedicated Delaware team processed an additional 1,769 applications, serving all three counties across the state.



COMING IN 2024: Mobile Energy Center

With newly secured funding, outfitting a Mobile Energy Center (MEC) will allow us to support income eligible families anytime, anywhere. Our team will prioritize locations such as churches, libraries, and community centers in high energy burden Philadelphia neighborhoods to accommodate and serve working families.

Home Repair &

Weatherization

ECA provides high-quality energy conservation and weatherization services to income eligible residents of Philadelphia and the state of Delaware. Through long standing federal and local partnerships, we're able to approach energy efficiency holistically, starting with home stabilization and repair before moving on to weatherization and electrification.

2023 IMPACT

In 2023, ECA installed comprehensive energy efficiency measures in over 750 homes:

- 659 homes in Philadelphia
- 102 homes in Delaware

Of these homes, 139 of the structures required stabilization and repair before weatherization could be effective.

- 53 through the Built to Last program in Philadelphia
- 86 in Delaware through the PreWeatherization Program

We've already seen a difference in our energy bill! I have several children with asthma and we haven't had a single medical issue since they finished the work.

COMING IN 2024: Expanding Home Repair

As the poorest major city in the country, it's no surprise that cost is the main barrier for Philadelphians to be able to keep up with home repair expenses, making energy efficiency measures nonviable. In the coming year, we're poised to scale up our home repair work through the Built to Last program, making up to 150 family houses newly eligible for weatherization in 2024.



Heating & Cooling

Crisis Support



For over 30 years, ECA has operated Philadelphia's only crisis hotline for income eligible residents facing heating system breakage during winter. We coordinate free heater repair or replacement to keep our vulnerable residents safe and warm.

Since we took on the Heater Hotline in the 1990s, we've expanded into preventative maintenance, began operations in the state of Delaware, and piloted crisis cooling support for Philadelphia in summer 2023.

HEATER HOTLINE

Our experienced and committed five person team takes over 15,000 calls from Philadelphians in crisis every heating season. With current funding, we were able to visit **2,675 homes to provide emergency support.**

Our burgeoning team in Delaware helped **51 families restore heat** in 2023.

PREVENTION

Many of the heater breakages that our technicians see during Heater Hotline visits could be prevented with proper system maintenance. During the off season, our Philadelphia team visited 1,375 houses to provide "Clean 'n' Tune" and preventative maintenance services.

UNIT REPLACEMENT

When heating units cannot be repaired, ECA coordinates homeowner access to federal funding for full system replacement. In 2023, our Philadelphia team replaced 532 heaters and our Delaware team replaced 10 heaters, keeping community members comfortable in their homes for years to come.

COOLING CRISIS

As Philadelphia continues to see hotter weather year after year, the necessity of providing emergency cooling support has become evident. In partnership with the state of PA, ECA piloted a cooling crisis program in 2023 and we were able to **distribute and install 876 A/C units and fans.**
